The King is Near! Prepare the royal highway; The King of kings is near! Let ev'ry hill and valley A level road appear! Then greet the King of glory, Foretold in sacred story: Hosanna to the Lord, For he fulfills God's Word! ("Prepare the Royal Highway" LWB #26)

The preparing we do during Advent is a preparation that is filled with a new beginning, hope and the promise of a greater future.

The coming of the "King of kings" as an infant child, one who will bring an end to the rule of sin in our lives, is the hope and expectation of our Advent preparation. As we look forward to the celebration of Christmas and the birth of the Christ child, we are reminded of the reason for Christ's birth.

Jesus came in human form to restore us to a right relationship with our God, to secure for us the forgiveness of sins, and to live as an example of the life God desires all of His children to live. Christ's life is the template for how we are to be in relationship with our God and with one another. Jesus calls us to look not only at ourselves and our own selfish desires, but to lift our heads up from our navels and engage the world and those around us in love, mercy, and justice. We have an open invitation to walk with God every day of our lives. In short, Jesus' birth is an end to the old rule of sin in our lives.

During His life, Jesus healed the lame, restored sight to the blind, bound up the broken hearted, cured the sick, calmed storms, and proclaimed the in-breaking of God's holy kingdom. It is this kingdom's in-breaking that provides a second level of our Advent preparation.

We are not just preparing for the birth of a child, but the return of our Lord Jesus as he ushers in the completeness of God's eternal kingdom. Scripture tells us time and again that in that kingdom, there will be no more tears, no pain or sorrow. We will know the eternal joy of God's love, grace and mercy.

We do experience the in-breaking of this kingdom during our lives, and it is these experiences that fill us with greater expectation of the coming fullness of God's kingdom. When Christ comes again, indeed, the world as we know it will end, but we have the promise that we will move into a greater future.

I invite you to come and join together with all members and friends of ALC as we finish preparing the royal highway once again because our King of kings is near. For that, we can sing Hosanna to the Lord!
