Struggling with Lent?

Sometimes when we decide to give something up for the six weeks of the Lenten season, we end up complaining about giving that something up, missing it and feeling more miserable than renewed. We also tend to go right back to what we have given up after Lent is over. If you did choose to give something up, how is it going now that we are a little over two weeks into Lent?

If you find yourself struggling to maintain your Lenten discipline, know that it is normal. If you did not give something up, do you feel a void in your faith journey this Lent?

You might want to try adding something new to your routine for the remainder of Lent, something that is meaningful to you. Maybe you could add a few extra minutes of prayer or read a book of the Bible that you have not read before or last read a long time ago. Perhaps you could get involved in a community project or give some time to a local charity. It doesn't have to be something that takes a great deal of time out of your schedule, but just an intentional few minutes a day or an hour or two a week. Lent is not only about self-denial, but it is also about growing in our faith and understanding how it connects to the world around us.

One quick and easy idea is to join with other members of ALC on Wednesday nights for Soup and Soul. The soup supper starts at 6 p.m. Not only is the food good, the time of fellowship that surrounds it is a wonderful opportunity to get to know other members better and grow in friendship with one another. The soul part of the evening is a short time of worship and study. Each week we will begin and end with devotion time using Holden Evening Prayer. This year we are also taking some time to do a more in-depth study of Jesus' insightful parable of the Good Samaritan.

We also have Lenten devotionals available that provide a brief meditation for each of the 40 days of Lent. The devotions focus on the joy in Jesus' presence and are very uplifting.

It is my hope that you are having a good Lenten season and God's love and grace are with you each day as we journey toward the end of Lent and the great Easter celebration.
